We were thrilled in December 2023 to win the Most Sustainable Small Business Award at the Cornwall Sustainability Awards. However it simply hasn't lasted. We've also found maintenance of the wooden body-work on all carriages to be a continual job. So after some head-scratching Dave came up with a plan to use fibreglass instead. This involves restoring an original frame to a high standard, then taking a mould from it. He's very pleased with his work so far. Dave's also made a fibreglass panel for the side of the coach. Fixing it required the assistance of the complete Friday team!



Railholiday gift vouchers make great presents. They come with a gift card, are fully transferable with no use-by date and can be cashed in for a £30 admin fee.


